AREA SOCCER CLUB EXPANDS – QUEEN ANNE’S SOCCER CLUB

Centreville, MD –March 8, 2010 – Queen Anne’s County Independent Soccer Club, a non-profit organization and the leading recreational soccer club on the mid-shore, today announced that it is expanding it’s charter to also include travel team play. As part of the expansion the club, it is also modifying its name to *Queen Anne’s Soccer Club*.

For over 20 years, the club has been providing Centreville and the surrounding communities a place for local youth to learn and play soccer including both boys and girls 4 to 14 years old. “There has been a terrific commitment from the community including parents and volunteers, over the years”, says Joe Grabis, past president. Joe also added, “We’ve seen the club grow from a couple hundred to over 600 players today”.

The expansion into travel team play for the club is to build upon the club’s desire to provide the youth of the local counties a high quality, safe, friendly and rewarding outlet through soccer that includes both recreational and competitive travel teams. “With the growth of soccer not only here, but throughout the state and nation, we were seeing kids leave our club and area to pursue more competitive alternatives to what we were offering”, according to Willy Agee, President of Queen Anne’s Soccer Club, “We saw that we needed to grow to keep up with the evolving needs of the familiesarea”.

Queen Anne’s Soccer Club now offers two fully resourced soccer divisions:

1) a **Recreation Division** for kids interested in learning and enjoying soccer. The recreation division is open for girls and boys in the following age brackets: 4, 5/6; 7/8, 9/10 and U15

2) a **Travel Division** for kids interested in more competitive and developmental play. Travel teams for boys and girls will be available in the U-10 and U-12, and U14 age groups.
